Theme :- The theme of the Ecstasy of Rita Joe is the destruction of a native girl by the white city culture.

Themes :-

1. Canadian Judicial System
2. Christian Idea of God / Bible
3. Flash back of Past (Rita).
4. Women Condition.
5. Police entrapped, (Rita, Jaimie)

Rita Joe was earlier in the reservations but comes to the city from in search of fortune and works in a type company. One night as she was returning from work some white policemen called her and gave her [5 dollars] and booked her under prostitution and produced her in the Magistrate's court. Here Many fake cases like [prostitution, theft, vagrancy, assault, shop lifting] are charged on her.

On looking at Rita the Magistrate remembers seeing a 4 year old little girl running bef barefooted in the road in [Cariboo] and asks her if it was her daughter. Then he asks her to find witness for her and produce them in the court within [8 hours].

First comes her School Board Clerk, who says that the Department of education had given many offers to the Indians but Rita Joe has never responded. But in reality none of these letters were delivered to the Indians. Then comes her teacher [Miss Donohue] who says that Rita recollects that her white teacher used to call her "A bitch in heat".

Even the policemen and other witness speak against Rita so the Magistrate sentences her for [30 days]. Rita Joe is a lover of freedom but now she is a jail bird. While all this happens in the Court Rita Joe's mind recollects her Past where she spent her early days happily with her sister (Eileen Joe), her father David Joe and her lover Jimile Paul.

Eileen Joe also had come to the city with a hope of making good fortune because she was good in stitching but since the white did not support her she had to return to the Reservation. Her father David Joe loved Rita.

Once they neighbours [Sandy Collins] who had lost their daughter [Millie] had asked David to sell Rita to them for [1000 dollars] but he had refused. Rita also recollects memories of her mother who has passed away while she is in prison. Father Andrew comes to meet the prisoners. He offers her a packet of cigarettes. He advises her to leave the city and return to the reservation.

Rita Joe tells him that her uncle [Dan Joe] had told her that they all lived a very happy and peaceful life before the white settlers came. The white settlers took away their land and freedom and gave them the Bible. Father Andrew gets angry and leaves the prison. Mr. Homer, a white social activist, runs a charity for the Red Indians and provides food and clothing to them but what he never realised is that they actually need is [job] and [respect].



After ³⁰ thirty days. Rita is released but Jaimie is sent to jail for 30 days. Rita Joe is ~~sent~~ released but Jaimie is sent ~~for~~ to jail for attacking Mr. Homer.

David comes and calls Rita back to the Reservations but Rita says that she will wait for Jaimie and come with ~~Rita~~ him after his release. Jaimie gets released and while he and Rita are together three murders come and try to seduce Rita. Jaimie ~~try~~ defending Rita gets mortally beaten up. Then they gang rape Rita and kill her. David comes carrying Jaimie's dead body and places it to Rita's body. Then he sings an ancient funeral song Eileen chants a prayer and the play ends with 'No. No! No more!'
